Safety: The Scouts BSA two-deep leadership structure will be implemented at all times. There must always be a female leader at meetings, on campouts, and during activities when girls are in attendance.

Meetings: Meetings will be on Monday nights from 7:30-8:45p, the same time that Troop 192 meets. Troop 7192 meets in the Central College Presbyterian Church “barn”. The troop meets separate from Troop 192 so girls have the opportunity to lead other girls.

Membership: All leaders and girls will fill out paperwork according to the Scouts BSA procedures. All leaders will take the Youth Protection Training 2.0 course and any other required position specific training. Girls will form their own patrol(s) and use the patrol system of

leadership. Dues are \$100/year (due in Nov./Dec.) for scouts and \$35/year for adult members, the same as for Troop 192.

Campouts: Troop 7192 plans campouts and activities each month. Many campouts are geared toward earning a merit badge or learning a skill. Troop 7192 may participate in 1-3 campouts per year with Troop 192. On campouts, Troop 7192 will reserve a different campsite than Troop 192.

Cold Weather “Campouts”: November, January and February “campouts” will often be held indoors and geared toward earning a merit badge.

Service Projects: Troop 7192 will participate in many of the same service projects as Troop 192, such as CCPC Freedom Celebration and Easter Sunrise parking, CCPC Holiday Food Baskets, and WARM food sorting. Troop 7192 will participate in other service projects, such as assisting/greeting veterans at the Honor Flight evening “welcome home” celebration sponsored by the Westerville community each September.

Fundraising: Troop 7192 will participate in popcorn sales, Jack Links BSA sales, and other fundraisers. Fundraisers are used to lessen the cost of summer camp and campouts, buy equipment, or to purchase merit badges.

Advancement: All girls start by working on the Scout Rank. Meetings are geared to encourage advancement through the ranks and learn skills and new things. The expectation is that the older girls lead and help the younger scouts. Some meetings and campouts will be geared toward working on merit badges. Eagle Rank needs to be attained before the 18th birthday. Scouts who enroll after the age of 16 can have up to 2 years from their join date to achieve the rank of Eagle.

Summer Camp – The girls of troop 7192 will decide where to attend a Scouts BSA Summer Camp or travel on an “Adventure Week”, to a place and activity of their choosing.
